



Grand Round on Antimicrobial Resistance Awareness

In commemoration of this year's World Antimicrobial Awareness Week (WAAW 2021), the MUST Antimicrobial Stewardship Club (AMS Club), Faculty of Medicine, will host a **Grand Round** on antimicrobial resistance (AMR) on **23 November 2021**.

The theme for this year's WAAW is 'Raise Awareness, Stop Resistance'. The overarching slogan for the WAAW is 'Antimicrobials: Handle with Care'. WAAW is celebrated from 18-24 November every year.

The Grand Round will be both physical and online and will involve presentations and discussions of a clinical case study on AMR by the Department of Pediatrics and Child Health and AMR-related research by the Department of Pharmacy.

The MUST AMS Club is supported by the Medicines, Technologies and Pharmaceutical Services (MTaPS) program and the Pharmaceutical Society of Uganda (PSU).
